

The purpose of the weekly *Influenza Watch* is to summarize current influenza surveillance in the City of Cleveland. *Please note that reported weekly data are preliminary and may change due to delayed submissions and additional laboratory results.*

Current Week (ending 02/02/2019)

- 20 new influenza diagnoses reported this week
- Influenza-like-illness (ILI) among emergency department visits: Elevated
- 0 influenza-associated pediatric mortalities reported this week
- 42% of influenza hospitalizations are male, 58% female.

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Influenza Activity in Ohio and City of Cleveland

Influenza activity was classified as "widespread" throughout Ohio during Week 5 (ending 02/02/2019). Through Week 5 of this influenza season, Ohio Department of Health (ODH) reported zero pediatric influenza-associated mortalities among patients under age 18 years. Public health surveillance data sources indicate low intensity for influenza-like illness (ILI) in outpatient settings reported by Ohio's sentinel providers. Ohio Department of Health has reported an additional 332 influenza-associated hospitalizations this week, bringing the season (2018-2019) total to 2160 influenza-associated hospitalizations. In the City of Cleveland activity slightly decreased from Week 4 (ending 1/26/2019). More than one peak of activity may be seen during influenza season, so **any City resident over 6 months of age who has not been vaccinated this season should get the shot now to protect themselves from influenza**.


