



CDPH is one of six Ohio Department of Health state-approved sites offering the **Project DAWN** program. **Project DAWN** provides individuals who use opioids and are at risk of death from an opioid overdose, family members and caretakers, education on how to recognize an overdose, how to respond to an overdose and how to administer Naloxone to reverse an opioid overdose. The program distributes kits containing the lifesaving drug naloxone to all participants in the program free of charge.

We are expanding from **Project DAWN** and premiering **Project LIFE (Limiting Involuntary Fentanyl Exposure)**, a pilot program adapted from the Columbus Public Health to reduce the rate of accidental overdose by limiting involuntary fentanyl exposure. Fentanyl testing strips are offered as a life-saving overdose prevention tool, empowering individuals who use drugs to know if a substance has been contaminated with fentanyl and to take action to reduce the risk of overdose.
