



Weekly Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Surveillance Report Friday, July 08, 2022

### **Report Contents**

The purpose of the COVID-19 Watch is to summarize the coronavirus surveillance in the City of Cleveland, Ohio. This summary report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 until July 2, 2022.

### **What Matters Most**

- 1. Cleveland COVID-19 cases increased during the week of June 26th with 348 new cases and a rate of 91 new cases per 100,000 residents. The true number of cases is likely much greater than is reported here, due to the fact that positive home tests are not being reported to the health department.
- 2. During each wave of the pandemic in Cleveland there have been two "peaks", meaning that during time periods with a high number of new cases there have been several weeks when the incidence rate declines slightly before rising again (Figure 1). Currently, Cleveland is experiencing that slight decline of new cases, so it is reasonable to expect another rise of new cases in the coming weeks.
- 3. The US Food and Drug Administration expanded the emergency use authorizations for the Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines. The Moderna vaccine has been authorized for anyone 6 months and older as a two-dose primary series with doses given 4 weeks apart. The Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine may be given as a three-dose primary series for infants 6 months through 4 years or a two dose primary series for children 5 years and older. Pediatricians' offices and pharmacies are the main sites where young children can get vaccinated.
- 4. According to the CDC, Cuyahoga County's COVID-19 Community Level moved from *low to medium* during the week of June 30th. COVID-19 Community Levels are based on the number of new hospital admissions due to COVID-19, the percentage of hospital beds occupied by COVID-19 patients, and the number of new cases. CDPH and the CDC recommend staying up-to-date with vaccination, and getting tested if you have symptoms. If you are at high risk for severe illness, consult with your doctor about additional precautions.
- 5. This past week, 430 residents received a COVID-19 booster shot. Overall, 48.5% of Cleveland residents have completed a primary vaccination series (two doses of Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech OR one dose of Johnson & Johnson) and 24.0% received their booster shot.
- 6. There were 7 COVID-19 hospitalizations during the week of June 26th. Weekly COVID-19 hospitalizations have been decreasing for the past month indicating the new cases have been resulting in mild illness. Vaccination and booster shots remain the best protection from severe illness, hospitalization, and death. COVID-19 vaccine first doses, second doses, and/or boosters can be scheduled by calling 216-664-2222 or visiting gettheshot.coronavirus.gov.

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\*\*Vaccine data were exported from the DataOhio Portal on July 5, 2022. Vaccination summaries include vaccinations administered to Cleveland residents by any supplier. In CDPH data reporting, individuals are counted in every group of which they meet the criteria. For example, a Cleveland resident who has completed a primary series and received a booster will be included in the counts of each group. Please note, the criteria to have "Completed a Primary Series" differs for individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.






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## Total Cases by Specimen Collection Date as of July 2, 2022

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



Figure 4. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Cases by Gender (Jun 26, 2022 - Jul 02, 2022) (based on 347 cases)





Figure 5. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Gender (Jun 05, 2022 - Jul 02, 2022) (based on 1,410 cases)











Figure 9. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Ethnicity (Jun 05, 2022 - Jul 02, 2022) (based on 1,420 cases)



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











Number of Vaccinated Cleveland Residents by Race (based on 201,313 residents)






### **Ethnicity**







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



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





Number of Boosted Cleveland Residents by Race (based on 74,512 residents)






### **Ethnicity**

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These graphs represent Cleveland residents who received a booster dose. Booster % represents number of people who received their booster dose among the population of that group.






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## **Hospitalization by Admission Date**








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








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
### **Total Deaths**

Figure 12. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Deaths by Demographics (Feb 15, 2020 - Jul 02, 2022) (based on 996 cases)









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



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

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### **Disclaimers**

The Cuyahoga County numbers are approximate and have been populated using the DataOhio Portal.

Case Definitions: Confirmed: Meets confirmatory laboratory evidence. NOTE: People with no symptoms and with a confirmatory positive test are reportable as confirmed cases. **Probable:** 1} Does not have a confirmatory positive test but meets symptom(s) criteria AND has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2. 2} Has a positive antigen test AND was reported on or after 11/1/2020. (For reports received prior to 11/1/2020: Has a positive antigen test AND either meets symptom(s) criteria OR has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2). 3}No confirmatory positive test for but SARS-CoV-2 is listed on the death certificate as a cause of death.

#### Metadata

This data report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 through July 2, 2022 for the City of Cleveland, Ohio.

Total Cases represent confirmed and probable cases.

Cleveland City data and Cuyahoga County data are compiled on July 5, 2022 using the DataOhio Portal.

Population and demographic data are from the US Census Bureau's 2019 estimates.

Data is preliminary and subject to change as more information is gained.

There may be a delay in reporting.

Data is reported by test date. If test date is unknown, date reported is used as a substitute for the test date. The number of cases can vary based on date used for analysis.
