What Matters Most

- 1. Cleveland COVID-19 cases increased during the week of August 21st with 678 new cases and a rate of 177 new cases per 100,000 residents and the CDC's COVID-19 Community Level remains *high* as of August 25th. CDPH recommends wearing a mask in public and staying up-to-date with vaccination and booster shots.
- 2. Nearly 20% of COVID-19 cases during the week of August 21st were among Cleveland residents under 20 years of age. CDPH is working with administrators in K-12 schools to quickly respond to potential outbreaks and provide guidance on mitigation strategies to reduce the number of cases in this age group.
- 3. Over 400 Cleveland residents completed their primary vaccination series during this reporting week. As of August 30th, 56.0% of Cleveland residents have received any dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, 49.4% have completed their primary vaccination series, and 24.4% have received a booster dose. Cleveland has a vaccination goal of having 60% of residents vaccinated for COVID-19. Appointment for adults and children can be made by calling 216-664-2222 or visiting gettheshot.coronavirus.gov.
- 4. The FDA has authorized the new bivalent booster shots from Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna. The new shots mix the original COVID-19 vaccines with updated versions to protect against Omicron subvariants, which account for most new cases in the US. The goal is that to reduce COVID-19 deaths and prevent a winter surge similar to the first Omicron wave. An advisory committee with the CDC will meet to set recommendations for the public before they will be available for distribution.
- 5. COVID-19 cases are leveling off from their rise over the summer. We can help prevent these numbers from increasing again by staying up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccinations. The good news is that 77% of adults over age 18 years have received a primary series at this point. However, only half of booster-eligible adults have gotten a booster, and only 34% of adults ages 50 years and older have gotten a second booster. Vaccine effectiveness can decrease over time, but boosters restore protection against serious illness and death.
- 6. Remember the steps to take if you test positive for COVID-19. Regardless of vaccination status, if you test positive you should immediately self-isolate and away from others for five days. Day 0 of isolation is the first day you had symptoms or the day you tested positive if you did not have symptoms. If you had symptoms, you can end isolation after day five if you are fever free for 24 hours and if your symptoms are improving. You should wear a mask for the next five days.

**Vaccine data were exported from the DataOhio Portal on August 30, 2022. Vaccination summaries include vaccinations administered to Cleveland residents by any supplier. In CDPH data reporting, individuals are counted in every group of which they meet the criteria. For example, a Cleveland resident who has completed a primary series and received a booster will be included in the counts of each group. Please note, the criteria to have "Completed a Primary Series" differs for individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.





Figure 4. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Cases by Gender (Aug 21, 2022 - Aug 27, 2022) (based on 672 cases)





Figure 5. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Gender (Jul 31, 2022 - Aug 27, 2022) (based on 2,800 cases)











Figure 9. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Ethnicity (Jul 31, 2022 - Aug 27, 2022) (based on 2,812 cases)








Demographics of Cleveland Residents who have received any dose of vaccine through August 27, 2022






% of Cleveland Residents Vaccinated per Age Group







Number of Vaccinated Cleveland Residents by Race (based on 208,424 residents)




Demographics of Cleveland Residents who received a booster dose through August 27, 2022



























Disclaimers

The Cuyahoga County numbers are approximate and have been populated using the DataOhio Portal.

<u>Case Definitions:</u> Confirmed: Meets confirmatory laboratory evidence. NOTE: People with no symptoms and with a confirmatory positive test are reportable as confirmed cases. **Probable:** 1} Does not have a confirmatory positive test but meets symptom(s) criteria **AND** has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2. 2} Has a positive antigen test **AND** was reported on or after 11/1/2020. (For reports received prior to 11/1/2020: Has a positive antigen test **AND** either meets symptom(s) criteria **OR** has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2). 3}No confirmatory positive test for but SARS-CoV-2 is listed on the death certificate as a cause of death.

Metadata

This data report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 through August 27, 2022 for the City of Cleveland, Ohio.

Total Cases represent confirmed and probable cases.

Cleveland City data and Cuyahoga County data are compiled on August 30, 2022 using the DataOhio Portal.

Population and demographic data are from the US Census Bureau's 2020 estimates.

Data is preliminary and subject to change as more information is gained.

There may be a delay in reporting.

Data is reported by test date. If test date is unknown, date reported is used as a substitute for the test date. The number of cases can vary based on date used for analysis.
