### **What Matters Most**

- 1. Cleveland COVID-19 cases remained steady during the week of August 28th with 584 new cases and a rate of 152 new cases per 100,000 residents. This was significantly lower than the rate in all of Ohio which was 184 new cases per 100,000 residents. The CDC's COVID-19 Community Level for Cuyahoga County remain *medium* as of September 15th. CDPH recommends staying up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccination.
- 2. Over 259 Cleveland residents completed their primary vaccination series this week. As of September 13th, 56.1% of Cleveland residents have received any dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, 49.5% have completed their primary vaccination series, and 24.4% have received a booster dose. Cleveland has a vaccination goal of having 60% of residents vaccinated for COVID-19. Appointments for adults and children can be made by calling 216-664-2222 or visiting gettheshot.coronavirus.gov.
- 3. A new COVID-19 subvariant, Omicron BA.4.6, is now spreading. This new variant accounts for 9% of recent cases in the US and has been identified in other countries. The new subvariant is expected to be as transmissible and cause comparable case severity to earlier Omicron subvariants which have been more transmissible than the original strain but cause less disease severity.
- 4. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) now recommend the new bivalent COVID-19 boosters from Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna. The Moderna bivalent booster is authorized for use in individuals 18 years of age and older while the Pfizer-BioNTech bivalent booster is authorized for use in individuals 12 years of age and older. The new boosters provide protection against the Omicron subvariants in addition to the original strain. These new boosters are now available at all CDPH COVID vaccine clinics.
- 5. With the fall and winter around the corner, CDPH is urging Cleveland residents to get both the updated COVID-19 booster and their annual flu shot. Disease forecasters are concerned that this flu season will be worse than previous years. The Southern Hemisphere experienced a higher-than-average number of cases during their 2022 flu season, which typically runs April to October and is an indicator of the potential severity of the upcoming season in the US. Getting a COVID-19 booster and flu shot provides the best defense against severe infection as we approach the end of the year.

\*\*Vaccine data were exported from the DataOhio Portal on September 13, 2022. Vaccination summaries include vaccinations administered to Cleveland residents by any supplier. In CDPH data reporting, individuals are counted in every group of which they meet the criteria. For example, a Cleveland resident who has completed a primary series and received a booster will be included in the counts of each group. Please note, the criteria to have "Completed a Primary Series" differs for individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.





Figure 4. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Cases by Gender (Sep 04, 2022 - Sep 10, 2022) (based on 583 cases)





Figure 5. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Gender (Aug 14, 2022 - Sep 10, 2022) (based on 2,554 cases)











Figure 9. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Ethnicity (Aug 14, 2022 - Sep 10, 2022) (based on 2,564 cases)











Number of Vaccinated Cleveland Residents by Race (based on 208,939 residents)







# Demographics of Cleveland Residents who received a booster dose through September 10, 2022





























### **Disclaimers**

The Cuyahoga County numbers are approximate and have been populated using the DataOhio Portal.

<u>Case Definitions:</u> Confirmed: Meets confirmatory laboratory evidence. NOTE: People with no symptoms and with a confirmatory positive test are reportable as confirmed cases. **Probable:** 1} Does not have a confirmatory positive test but meets symptom(s) criteria **AND** has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2. 2} Has a positive antigen test **AND** was reported on or after 11/1/2020. (For reports received prior to 11/1/2020: Has a positive antigen test **AND** either meets symptom(s) criteria **OR** has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2). 3}No confirmatory positive test for but SARS-CoV-2 is listed on the death certificate as a cause of death.

#### Metadata

This data report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 through September 10, 2022 for the City of Cleveland, Ohio.

Total Cases represent confirmed and probable cases.

Cleveland City data and Cuyahoga County data are compiled on September 13, 2022 using the DataOhio Portal.

Population and demographic data are from the US Census Bureau's 2020 estimates.

Data is preliminary and subject to change as more information is gained.

There may be a delay in reporting.

Data is reported by test date. If test date is unknown, date reported is used as a substitute for the test date. The number of cases can vary based on date used for analysis.
