What Matters Most

- 1. Cleveland COVID-19 cases decreased during the week of September 10th with 548 new cases and a rate of 143 new cases per 100,000 residents. This was significantly lower than the rate in all of Ohio which was 174 new cases per 100,000 residents. The true incidence is likely higher due to positive home tests throughout the state that may not be reported to the health department. The CDC's COVID-19 Community Level for Cuyahoga County remain *medium* as of September 15th. CDPH recommends staying up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccination.
- 2. A larger percentage of COVID-19 cases were among residents between 60-69 years old. Cleveland residents between 60-69 years old comprise 11% of the population but 30% of the COVID-19 hospitalizations this week. This may explain why COVID-19 case decreased while COVID-19 hospitalization did not.
- 3. Over 248 Cleveland residents received a COVID-19 booster shot this week. As of September 20th, 56.1% of Cleveland residents have received any dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, 49.6% have completed their primary vaccination series, and 24.5% have received a booster dose. Cleveland has a vaccination goal of having 60% of residents vaccinated for COVID-19. Appointments for adults and children can be made by calling 216-664-2222 or visiting gettheshot.coronavirus.gov.
- 4. A new COVID-19 subvariant, Omicron BA.4.6, is now spreading. This new variant accounts for 9% of recent cases in the US and has been identified in other countries. The new subvariant is expected to be as transmissible and cause comparable case severity to earlier Omicron subvariants which have been more transmissible than the original strain but cause less disease severity.
- 5. Health experts recommend getting both a COVID-19 booster and flu shot whenever convenient, however, they also note that October is the best time to get both. This is in order provide immunity to both COVID-19 and the flu that will last until through the fall and winter months. Experts say that getting both your COVID-19 booster and flu shot at the same time is safe and won't weaken your immune system.

**Vaccine data were exported from the DataOhio Portal on September 20, 2022. Vaccination summaries include vaccinations administered to Cleveland residents by any supplier. In CDPH data reporting, individuals are counted in every group of which they meet the criteria. For example, a Cleveland resident who has completed a primary series and received a booster will be included in the counts of each group. Please note, the criteria to have "Completed a Primary Series" differs for individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.





Figure 4. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Cases by Gender (Sep 11, 2022 - Sep 17, 2022) (based on 543 cases)





Figure 5. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Gender (Aug 21, 2022 - Sep 17, 2022) (based on 2,448 cases)











Figure 9. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Ethnicity (Aug 21, 2022 - Sep 17, 2022) (based on 2,462 cases)




Demographics of Cleveland Residents who have received any dose of vaccine through September 17, 2022


Age Groups







Number of Vaccinated Cleveland Residents by Race (based on 209,216 residents)




Demographics of Cleveland Residents who received a booster dose through September 17, 2022








Demographics of Cleveland Residents who received a booster dose through September 17, 2022

























Disclaimers

The Cuyahoga County numbers are approximate and have been populated using the DataOhio Portal.

<u>Case Definitions:</u> Confirmed: Meets confirmatory laboratory evidence. NOTE: People with no symptoms and with a confirmatory positive test are reportable as confirmed cases. **Probable:** 1} Does not have a confirmatory positive test but meets symptom(s) criteria **AND** has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2. 2} Has a positive antigen test **AND** was reported on or after 11/1/2020. (For reports received prior to 11/1/2020: Has a positive antigen test **AND** either meets symptom(s) criteria **OR** has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2). 3}No confirmatory positive test for but SARS-CoV-2 is listed on the death certificate as a cause of death.

Metadata

This data report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 through September 17, 2022 for the City of Cleveland, Ohio.

Total Cases represent confirmed and probable cases.

Cleveland City data and Cuyahoga County data are compiled on September 20, 2022 using the DataOhio Portal.

Population and demographic data are from the US Census Bureau's 2020 estimates.

Data is preliminary and subject to change as more information is gained.

There may be a delay in reporting.

Data is reported by test date. If test date is unknown, date reported is used as a substitute for the test date. The number of cases can vary based on date used for analysis.
