



Weekly Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Surveillance Report Friday, November 04, 2022

Report Contents

The purpose of the COVID-19 Watch is to summarize the coronavirus surveillance in the City of Cleveland, Ohio. This summary report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 until October 29, 2022.

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What Matters Most

- 1. Cleveland COVID-19 cases increased during the week of October 23rd with 382 new cases and a rate of 100 new cases per 100,000 residents. This is consistent with the increase in COVID in the state of Ohio, which had an incidence of 99 new cases per 100,000 residents. The true incidence is likely higher due to positive home tests throughout the state that may not be reported to the health department.
- 2. Two new omicron subvariants, BQ.1 and BQ.1.1, now account for 27% of infections in the US as of October 29th. These variants are highly transmissible and have mutations that have been associated with immune escape and antibody evasion; however, current data does not indicate that they are associated with more severe illness than BA.4 and BA.5.
- 3. 356 Cleveland residents received their first COVID-19 shot this week. As of November 1st, 56.9% of Cleveland residents have received any dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, 50.0% have completed their primary vaccination series, and 25.1% have received a booster dose. Cleveland residents that already completed a primary vaccination series are also receiving the bivalent booster shots. - 4. Nationally and locally, COVID-19 incidence has been highest among older residents. This has particularly been the case for residents 75 years old and older who had an incidence of 177 new cases per 100,000 residents within the City of Cleveland. Out of all the COVID-19 hospitalizations, 73% were among Cleveland residents 60 years old and older. Older residents are more likely to have chronic illnesses such as heart disease, diabetes, and cancer which impact case severity of a COVID-19 infection.
- 5. As we approach the winter months and holiday season, consider additional strategies to prevent COVID-19 spread. The current omicron variants spread easily and evade immunity. Therefore, in addition to vaccination and boosters, consider masking indoors in public spaces and testing before large gatherings.

Vaccination summaries include vaccinations administered to Cleveland residents by any supplier. In CDPH data reporting, individuals are counted in every group of which they meet the criteria. For example, a Cleveland resident who has completed a primary series and received a booster will be included in the counts of each group. Please note, the criteria to have "Completed a Primary Series" differs for individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.






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Total Cases by Specimen Collection Date as of October 29, 2022

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

Figure 4. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Cases by Gender (Oct 23, 2022 - Oct 29, 2022) (based on 382 cases)





Figure 5. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Gender (Oct 02, 2022 - Oct 29, 2022) (based on 1,212 cases)











Figure 9. COVID-19 Cases in City of Cleveland by Ethnicity (Oct 02, 2022 - Oct 29, 2022) (based on 1,215 cases)



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





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







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Demographics of Cleveland Residents who have received any dose of vaccine through October 29, 2022


Number of Vaccinated Cleveland Residents by Race (based on 211,486 residents)









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














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Hospitalization by Admission Date








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

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






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

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




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City vs. County Comparisons—Total Number of Cases



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

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Disclaimers

The Cuyahoga County numbers are approximate and have been populated using the DataOhio Portal.

Case Definitions: Confirmed: Meets confirmatory laboratory evidence. NOTE: People with no symptoms and with a confirmatory positive test are reportable as confirmed cases. Probable: 1} Does not have a confirmatory positive test but meets symptom(s) criteria AND has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2. 2} Has a positive antigen test AND was reported on or after 11/1/2020. (For reports received prior to 11/1/2020: Has a positive antigen test AND either meets symptom(s) criteria OR has had close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2). 3}No confirmatory positive test for but SARS-CoV-2 is listed on the death certificate as a cause of death.

Metadata

This data report reflects the period starting from February 15, 2020 through October 29, 2022 for the City of Cleveland, Ohio.

Total Cases represent confirmed and probable cases.

Cleveland City data and Cuyahoga County data are compiled on November 1, 2022 using the DataOhio Portal.

Population and demographic data are from the US Census Bureau's 2020 estimates.

Data is preliminary and subject to change.

There may be a delay in reporting.

Data is reported by test date. If test date is unknown, date reported is used as a substitute for the test date. The number of cases can vary based on date used for analysis.
