The purpose of the COVID-19 Watch is to summarize the coronavirus surveillance and vaccine uptake in the City of Cleveland, Ohio. This report uses data available through January 2, 2023. Data on COVID-19 case demographics focus on the last four full weeks prior to publication (December 3 - December 30, 2023).

What Matters Most

- 1. Cleveland COVID-19 activity increased during the past four weeks with an average 7-day incidence rate of 96 new cases per 100,000 residents. This is comparable to state-wide COVID-19 activity during the same time frame which, averaged a 7-day incidence rate of 52 new cases per 100,000 residents.
- 2. As of January 2nd, 59.3% of Cleveland residents have received any dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, 51.4% have completed their primary vaccination series, and 27.3% have received a booster dose. Appointments for adults and children can be made visiting gettheshot.coronavirus.gov.
- 3. Cleveland Department of Public Health recommends the new booster to better protect patients from the new COVID-19 variants. The new boosters are available for everyone 6 months and older protect against serious outcomes of COVID-19 this fall and winter.
- 4. The Omicron subvariant JN.1 is now the strain that is causing the majority of new infections within our region. Like other Omicron subvariants it does not appear to be causing more severe illness than previous strains.
- 5. People without health insurance or with health plans that don't cover the cost can get a free vaccine from their local health centers and pharmacies participating in the CDC's Bridge Access Program. Visit vaccines.gov to find participating providers.











% of Cleveland Residents Vaccinated per Age Group




% of Cleveland Residents Boosted by Age Group







% of Cleveland Residents Boosted per Race Population







Figure 11. City of Cleveland COVID-19 Hospitalizations by Demographics (Feb 15, 2020 - Dec 30, 2023) (based on 6,337 cases)













By Gender





Metadata

The Cuyahoga County numbers are approximate and have been populated using the DataOhio Portal.

Total Cases represent confirmed and probable cases.

Cleveland City data and Cuyahoga County data are compiled on January 2, 2023 using the DataOhio Portal.

Population and demographic data are from the US Census Bureau's 2020 estimates.

Data is preliminary and subject to change.

There may be a delay in reporting.

Data is reported by test date. If test date is unknown, the date a case is reported to Ohio Department of Health is used as a substitute for the test date. The number of cases can vary based on dates used for analysis.
